

## INDUSTRY: INFECTIOUS LARYNGOTRACHEITIS (ILT) ADVISORY City of Kawartha Lakes, Ontario

## June 2, 2020

On behalf of the four feather boards, the Feather Board Command Centre (FBCC) is issuing an ILT Biosecurity Advisory to all commercial poultry farmers and small flock growers in central-western portion of the City of Kawartha Lakes. The Biosecurity Advisory Area is within the road boundaries of Glenarm Road (#8) on the north, Hartley Road on east, Woodville Rd (#9) on South and County Rd 46 on west. Map Link

FBCC has been alerted by the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs (OMAFRA) that a small, non-commercial chicken flock in the City of Kawartha lakes tested positive for Infectious Laryngotracheitis (ILT). All the birds have died or been euthanized.

Please reinforce your biosecurity protocols if working with flocks or providing service in this area. Please suspend all non-essential visits. For essential visits to premises where poultry is grown, apply the following recommended biosecurity measures: wearing boots, protection suits, hats and gloves/hand washing. All deliveries or loading in this Advisory Area should be last on the route. Wash and disinfect the truck's undercarriage and steps before proceeding with any other delivery/loading. Do not go to another farm within 12 hours.

Should you be aware of health concerns in flocks you deal with, please advise the farmer to contact their veterinarian as well as their Board.
